

ORGANIZATION AND ACTIVITY OF YOUTH STRUCTURES IN THE PROVINCE DURING THE HISTORICAL PERIOD OF INDEPENDENCE

Abstract: From the first days of the independence of the Republic of Uzbekistan, territorial structures were established in the Surkhandarya region, and they were intended to solve tasks and problems related to youth. The article talks about the organization and activities of these structures.

Introduction.

From the first days of the independence of the Republic of Uzbekistan, regional structures were established in the region, and they were intended to solve tasks and problems related to youth.

Materials and Methods.

In particular, in the period of independence, in 1993, for the implementation of the first law on youth policy, the regional governor's "On Measures for the Implementation of the Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan on the Basics of State Policy on Youth" in the region is important. a decision was made, in which the problems of the youth of the region in the socio-economic and cultural-spiritual spheres were clearly indicated.

In the years of independence, the "Talent" charity fund of the creative youth of Uzbekistan, the Creative Fund of Uzbekistan, the Cultural Fund and a number of other public organizations were established. They are carrying out a number of measures to increase the intellectual potential of different classes of the population, to motivate them in time, to provide moral support and social protection.

To find talented young people in the fields of literature, art and architecture, to direct their creative potential to strengthen and enrich the independence of our country and the spirituality of our people, and to raise their care to the level of modern requirements. On May 4, 1993, according to the decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. PF-601 "On the creation of the Republican fund of creative youth "Iste'dod" [1], the Republican fund "Iste'dod" was established.

The Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan adopted a number of decisions in order to further develop science and technology, art and culture. In 1993, the Uzbek Youth Fund named after Ulugbek was established in 1993 in order to ensure the prospects of the country and the future of the nation, to educate mature young people in all aspects, and to encourage talented young people.

The government of Uzbekistan hopes to deepen the purely humanitarian content of independence and to serve as a solid foundation of the society based on expanding the mental capabilities of the population and ensuring their spiritual maturity. Therefore, he looks critically at the actions taken. Opportunities are learned and corrected along the way. The activities of a number of public organizations supporting creative and scientific forces were evaluated from this point of view. As a

result, on April 17, 1996, in order to unite its forces and capabilities, the "Kamolot" foundation, which helps young artists, scientists and researchers, and deals with youth problems in general, was established[5].

In the Republic of Uzbekistan, various public organizations and institutions took an active part in solving the problems of young people and their social protection. In this regard, the "Kamolot" youth fund of the Republic of Uzbekistan has also carried out certain activities. The work carried out by the foundation is in various directions, especially the material and moral support of young families, finding, selecting, educating talented young people, directing them to study and acquire a profession are priorities. became important. The work carried out with low-income families with children and disabled children began to bear fruit.

In this regard, the work carried out in Surkhandarya region was also effective. For example, in 1996, the Surkhandarya branch of the youth fund "Kamolot" of the Republic of Uzbekistan provided 21,000 soums of sponsorship to children of the 2nd orphanage on June 1 International Children's Day, the "Kamolot" fund of the region 7,000 soums were allocated to reward the young people who won in various events.

350,000 soums were allocated for the purpose of providing parental support to schools in the region, greening and asphaltting school grounds [6].

In 1998, 8,000 soums were allocated for the conference of gifted students at the expense of the "Kamolot" fund in Surkhandarya region. Also, 4.5 thousand soums were allocated for "Innovation-98" activities in the region. In general, in the Republic of Uzbekistan, at the expense of the "Kamolot" fund, a large amount of work was carried out to sponsor various events, support talented young people, encourage enterprising young men and women, and increase their social activity. For example, the charter fund allocated to the regions during 1996-1998 was 26 million. 29.2 mln. 28.8 mln. 5.8 million soums, the funds allocated for office equipment and computers. 14.9 million soums, the amount spent on various events is 14.9 million. amounted to soums[8].

The "Hope" foundation was established on January 7, 1997 in order to sort, select and help talented young people to study in foreign countries and learn worldly experiences and world development[10].

In our country, uniting young people around the national idea, educating them in the spirit of devotion to the Motherland, raising them to become perfect people who serve the interests of the country and society has been raised to the level of state policy. The conditions and opportunities created for the development of the young generation under the leadership of the President are bearing fruit. "Kamolot" Foundation of Youth of Uzbekistan, the regional council of the "Kamolot" youth social movement, the festivals held in cooperation with the regional department of culture and sports affairs, consistent reforms, creativity and beautification works implemented in the years of independence, the population, especially women and girls conditions and opportunities created for young people are praised [11].

"Kamolot" youth social movement in Uzbekistan was established by the decision of the founding congress held on April 24, 2001[12]. "Kamolot" is a self-governing non-governmental non-profit organization. Those who recognize the movement's programmatic goals and tasks and the requirements of the statute, who actively work towards their implementation, who consider working and fighting for the development of the Motherland, peace of the country, and the welfare of the people as a vital belief for him, membership of young people between the ages of 14 and 30, regardless of gender, race, nationality, language, religion, personal and social status, who can be an example to others in winter, work, military service, public affairs possible The basis of the movement is primary organizations, which are formed based on the will of young people in all educational institutions, armed forces, and law enforcement systems of the country. Each primary organization has a Leader who is elected by a majority of votes at its Annual General Meeting. The movement has the status of a

legal entity in the Republic of Karakalpakstan, regions and the city of Tashkent, as well as district and city departments. Also, a branch of "Yetakchi" youth center operates. There are 11 district branches of the council with the status of a legal entity and a Council of Leaders in the "Youth" student campus, whose highest body is a conference convened once in 2.5 years. The Tashkent branch of "Kamolot" established the "Bunyodkor" youth club with partner organizations. There are a total of 672 primary organizations of "Kamolot" in Tashkent, the number of members of which is 338,805[11]. The decision of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan on supporting the "Kamolot" youth social movement and increasing its effectiveness was of great importance in further improving its activity.

The place and role of "Kamolot" youth social movement in social protection of young people and solving their problems has been increasing. The work carried out by the Surkhandarya branch of the movement was also very effective. The department has carried out a wide range of activities related to the comprehensive support of young people, the realization of their talents, and the material and economic provision of those in need of social protection. For example, in Termiz district alone, in 2004, small enterprises spent 14,192 soums on solving youth problems, while in Termiz city, this amount reached 46,100 soums. Voluntary allocations of sponsors in Termiz district reached 486 thousand soums[9]. During the studied period, a lot of work was done in terms of social protection of orphans, their material and spiritual support. In Surkhandarya region in 2005, 18,425 families were given bereavement pensions and social allowances. Among them, 43,288 children of 17,762 families were given a survivor's pension, the amount of which was 4,891,54,400 soums per month, and they were paid on time through the communication departments. In 2005, in the region, 742 children of 374 families were awarded social allowance for the loss of a breadwinner. There are 651 orphans who have lost their parents, and 396 families have taken them under their care based on the decision of district governors on guardianship and sponsorship. Pensions and social allowances were paid to them on time, clothes were brought to 360 of them from South Korea[13].

During the years of independence in our country, large-scale work was carried out to educate young people to be spiritually mature and physically healthy, patriotic and selfless, and to protect their rights and interests.

Nevertheless, the most urgent issues in the life of young people, especially the work carried out on creating conditions and opportunities for unorganized young people to find their place in life, guiding them to the profession and ensuring their employment, and encouraging their initiatives, are not up to the level of demand. Life itself confirms.

To create wide conditions for a large number of young people living in places, especially in remote areas, to realize their talent and talents, to engage in entrepreneurial activities, to protect them from the influence of various harmful vices and alien ideas. Life itself shows that the "Kamolot" youth social movement could not become a mass movement that unites and mobilizes the youth of Uzbekistan towards great goals in solving important tasks such as early prevention of offenses among young people.

Therefore, in order to fundamentally improve the activity in this field and raise it to a new level of high quality, on July 5, 2017, the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. Decree [2] was adopted.

In accordance with the decree, the youth union of Uzbekistan was established on the basis of the youth social movement "Kamolot" in order to implement the state policy on youth consistently and effectively, provide comprehensive support to young people, and fundamentally reform the system of protecting their rights and legal interests. .

June 30, the day of the establishment of the Youth Union of Uzbekistan, is celebrated as "Youth Day" in our country.

A number of events, meetings, and projects related to increasing youth activity in reforms within the framework of the Strategy of Actions on the five priority areas of development of the Republic of Uzbekistan in 2017-2021 have been implemented in the Youth Union of Uzbekistan.

Results and discussion.

Establishing close cooperation with our compatriots living and working abroad, especially scientists, specialists and talented young people with great scientific potential, is also necessary for the all-round and rapid development of Uzbekistan, competitive in the world labor market and PF-5545 of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan on September 25, 2018 in order to provide personnel for highly qualified specialists in leading foreign educational institutions and in Uzbekistan by training and improving their qualifications In accordance with the decree[3] on the organization of the activities of the "El-yurt umidi" fund on communication with compatriots, the center for training specialists abroad and communication with compatriots under the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uzbekistan "El-yurt umidi" fund for training specialists abroad and communicating with compatriots under the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan was reorganized.

Conclusion.

In accordance with the Decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated June 30, 2020 "On measures to fundamentally reform and bring the youth policy to a new level in the Republic of Uzbekistan", on June 30, 2020 O' According to the decision of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan PQ-4768 "On the organization of the activities of the Youth Affairs Agency of the Republic of Uzbekistan" [4], the Youth Affairs Agency of the Republic of Uzbekistan was established.

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
